Background

Estimates suggest that 150 million Europeans use CAM annually but reliable data are scarce. CAM is defined in various and sometimes contradictory ways within Europe and the national legal status of CAM is sometimes unclear. The overall goals of the FP7-funded coordination project CAMbrella are to describe the situation of CAM in the EU and based on this to propose a roadmap for future CAM research. CAMbrella also aims to facilitate sustainable, high quality research collaboration, and will create a coordinated EU network of researchers and stakeholders including patients, funding bodies and registered clinicians.

Corresponding to the specific aims the project is subdivided into separate work packages which work and results will be presented in Sessions 1 and 2 of this conference. Based on the available information, a strategic roadmap for European research activities will be presented in Session 3 to identify the most relevant research areas where progress is highly needed. The presentation of the project results will be completed by a discussion together with the audience on the recommendations regarding CAM research.

CAMbrella involves a consortium of 16 academic research institutions from 12 European countries. The project is accompanied by an Advisory Board which encompasses 12 international organisations representing different stakeholders in the field of CAM.


